Ataturk's Address to the Turkish Youth

You, the Turkish youth! Your primary duty is to forever protect and defend the Turkish independence and Turkish Republic. This is the mainstay of your existence and of your future.

This foundation is your most precious treasure in the future, as well, there will be malevolents, within and abroad, who will seek to deny your birthright. If one day you are compelled to defend your independence and the republic, you shall not reflect on the conditions and possibilities of the situation in which you find yourself, in order to accomplish your mission. These conditions and possibilities may appear unfavorable. The adversaries who scheme against your independence and your Republic may be the representatives of a victory without precedent in the world. By force or by ruse, all citadels and all arsenals of our dear fatherland may have been taken; all of its armies may have been dispersed and all corners of the country may have been physically occupied. More distressing and more grievous than all these, those who hold and exercise the power within the country may have fallen into gross error, blunder, and even treason. These holders of power may have even united their personal interests with political ambitions of the invaders. The nation itself may have fallen into privation, and may have become exhausted and desolate.

You, the future sons and daughters of Turkey! Even under such circumstances and conditions, your duty is to redeem Turkish independence and the Republic! The strength you shall need exists in the noble blood flowing through your veins.

TAC Policy for Clubs

Club activities at Tarsus American College are organized to support student academic achievement as well as their development in social, cultural and athletic aspects. These activities are offered through the establishment of various clubs according to the interests and abilities of the students and under the guidance of the faculty.

Goals of Club Activities

- 1. **Personal Development:** Allowing students to discover and develop their personal talents.
- 2. **Social Skills:** Increasing cooperation, communication and teamwork skills.
- 3. **Sense of Responsibility:** Raising student awareness on taking responsibility and performing their duties within a group.
- 4. **Contribution to Society:** Encouraging participation in community service and social outreach projects.
- 5. Cultural Enrichment: Involving students in cultural, artistic and sporting activities.

Types of Clubs

- **Social Clubs:** Clubs that draw student interest in fields such as literature, philosophy, music and theater.
- Sports Clubs: Clubs offering different sports such as basketball, volleyball and soccer.
- **Science and Technology Clubs:** Clubs that encourage students in areas such as robotics, software, and natural sciences.
- **Community Service Clubs:** Clubs designed for community service projects.

Principles of Operation for Club Activities

1. Selecting and Participating in a Club

- Students may sign up for clubs based on their interests in the beginning of each academic year.
- o Each student must be a member of at least one club.

2. Club Meetings

- Clubs meet on a weekly basis.
- Meetings will be held during club hours or after school hours as appropriate.

3. Club Leadership

- o Each club is led by a teacher, who works with a student president.
- The club activities are planned and conducted by the teacher advisor.

4. Activity Reports

• Each club prepares an activity report at the end of the year and submits it to the school administration.

5. Review

• Club activities will be evaluated periodically by the school administration and improvements will be made as needed.

This policy is intended to contribute to the development of students as active and productive individuals outside of school. The successful implementation of all club activities requires close cooperation between teachers, students, and the school administration.



Club Experience at TAC

- Each TAC student is expected to take part in at least one club (Prep, 9th, 10th, and 11th grades)
- The clubs on offer are introduced to students in the garden during the first week of the academic year.
- Every teacher must have a club. The number of teachers may be increased based on the number of students in the club.
- In club selections, students are placed in the order of their preference (two preferences) as much as possible.
- Students can "get to know" the club they were placed in during the first three weeks of school, and if they want to change their club, they should choose another club within the first three weeks. Students can switch to their new club (provided that it also is suitable) within the third week after the start of the club programme.
- Club changes will only be allowed within these first three weeks after the selections, as all
 clubs are designed to continue throughout the year. A student who wants to change his club
 must fill out the relevant form completely providing their explanations. Some clubs may select
 students according to the criteria that have been announced beforehand, which should be
 taken into account when changing a club.
- Attendance: Club activities, like classes, are events that require student attendance.
- The students who do not attend the club hour without a valid excuse or permission while being at school will face administrative action.
- A student who does not attend club activities is handled in the same way as having deliberately missed a regular lesson and will face the same consequences.
- Joining Club Activities: Students learn whether the club they join requires activities such as
 after-school, lunch break or weekend work, out-of-school trips, project preparation, in the
 beginning of the school year (during the first three weeks), and they are required to
 participate in these components.
- Students can earn TAC Points for their various types of involvement in their clubs with the recommendation of the teacher.
- **Teacher Advisor:** Each club and committee has a teacher advisor. After-school work, theater, concerts, trips and other kinds of student activities are all carried out only under the responsibility of the teacher advisor and with prior permission from the School Administration.
- Clubs exhibit their work throughout the year through various events, competitions and
 organizations. They share these with the whole school during the last week of the academic
 year by making a presentation about the highlights of their club's activities. The decision
 about whether this presentation will be held in the auditorium or in the garden should be
 stated on the relevant form at the time of opening the club.
- All trips planned internationally for a club must be approved by the Health and Education Foundation, our parent organization.
- In all kinds of intercity events planned off-campus, in addition to the approval and permission of the School Administration, the parent permission form must be filled in by each student and submitted to the club teacher. Please contact the Activity Coordinator for details on this.
- Attendance Requirement: Each club session must be actively conducted at the designated time and day of the week.
- Each teacher advisor will be notified of the classroom or room where their club will meet in the first week of the club activities. If there is a need to change classrooms due to the nature of the club activity, the vice principal in charge of clubs must be notified.



• Once joining a club, weekly regular attendance is mandatory to maintain the efficiency of the club activities. Attendance will be recorded weekly on Smartclass.

Forms and Documentation

Below are the documents and forms required for club procedures. You will also find these documents in Google Drive under "2024-2025 Club Activities".

Required Documentation

1. Petition for Starting a Club

An official petition submitted to the school administration by the teacher or students who
wish to start a club which states the purpose of the club, its area of activity, and the request
to offer the club.

2. The Formal Approval for Starting a Club

• The document stating the formal approval of the school administration which recognizes the establishment of the new club.

3. Club Membership Registration Form

 The form which includes the names, grade levels, and contact information of the students who wish to join the club. This form indicates that the students are official members of the club.

4. Club Activity Plan:

• A detailed plan outlining the activities, projects, and other activities the club plans to conduct throughout the year. This plan must be submitted to the school administration for approval.

5. Club Meeting Minutes:

 A record of the decisions made during each club meeting and the work being conducted in the club. These minutes are important for tracking club activities in the long run and should be prepared on a monthly basis.

6. Club Teacher Advisor Assignment Document:

• The assignment document for the teacher advisor who will supervise and guide the club's activities.

7. Yearly Activity Report:

• A report prepared by the club at the end of the year that summarizes the year's activities and results.

8. Permissions and Approvals:

• If the club is organizing an activity or trip outside of the school, these permission and approval documents obtained from the school administration or relevant authorities will be used.



9. List of the Club Steering Committee

• A list of the names and responsibilities of the club's president, vice president, secretary, and other officers. These documents help ensure that the club activities are run in an organized, disciplined manner and can be inspected by the school administration.
